CHAPLAINS CORNER

Precepts of the Church

Among the many titles used to refer to the Catholic Church, the title “Holy Mother Church” is frequently employed. Why? We are reborn and made new creations in the womb of the baptismal font (this is where we are “born again”; and an individual can only receive valid baptism once) by triple immersion in, or infusion (pouring) of water, while invoking the Blessed Trinity with the words, “**N., I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.**” We receive nourishment for our souls through Sacred Scripture (the Bible), Sacred Tradition, and the *Magisterium* (teaching authority) of Holy Church; most visibly in our worship and participation in the Sacraments. All of these components are the foundation necessary for living a Catholic Christian life. If we believe we can know and live the fullness of Truth on our own, we are deceiving ourselves. We need a Mother to give us birth, nourish, and guide us on our earthly pilgrimage.

Parents should desire to give children good order in their home and instill basic family/life rules and guidelines for the well being of the entire family. In the same sense that it would not be very responsible for parents to allow their children free reign do whatever they choose, practically relinquishing all parental guidance, our Holy Mother the Church has provided her children with *precepts*. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) relates:

The precepts of the Church are set in the context of a moral life bound to and nourished by liturgical life. The obligatory character of these positive laws decreed by the pastoral authorities is meant to guarantee to the faithful the indispensable minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor:

The first precept (“You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.”) requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary and the saints; in the first place by participating in the Eucharistic celebration when the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which would impede such sanctification of these days.

The second precept (“You shall confess your sins at least once a year.”) ensures preparation for the Eucharist by the reception of the sacrament of reconciliation, which continues Baptism’s work of conversion and forgiveness.

The third precept (“You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least during the Easter season.”) guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord’s Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy.

The fourth precept (“You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church”) ensures the times of acesis and penance which prepare us for the liturgical feasts and help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart.

The fifth precept (“You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church”) means that the faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability. (see CCC #s 2041-2043)

Two other decrees of guidance, which should not be taken lightly, are often added to the five above: obedience to the laws of the Church regarding Matrimony and the Christian responsibility to participate in the evangelization of souls. Our Mother has given a minimal framework for the external accountability of the faithful; a way of living for our sanctification and salvation. Her only desire is to lead her children on the surest path to almighty God, who always sees us as His very beloved sons and daughters. May He be well pleased with us.

They Came to Northport

October 30, 2011

They came. They came to Northport. The Dignity Memorial Vietnam Wall came to Northport also. It rested serenely behind a triangle of yellow and white flowers – the tip of the triangle coinciding with the indentation of the Wall's surface – where it angles off to the right. Beyond the flowers was a rectangular pool. On its surface floated in equal measure both debris of yesterday's Nor'easter and the beautiful amber and yellow leaves of autumn – as if to fittingly place before the Wall the stark contrasts of beauty and destruction.

They came. They came and saw the American flag flying highest but flanked slightly below by the black POW/MIA flag and the white Dignity Memorial flag. They came. They came and saw the small American flags and POW/MIA flags stuck at the base of the Wall. They saw the personal remembrances of loved ones too.

They came and heard the wistfully sad chimes of the White Chapel and sweet tone of the Northport High Choral Group. They came.

They came from places like the Florida panhandle, the woods of Maine, the mountains of Colorado, the plains of Wyoming, the bayous of Louisiana, the coast of Oregon and the streets of Brooklyn. They came and stayed, without minding the speeches, media cameras and reporters.


They were young when they came – ranging in age from around 18 to 40, but none of them will get any older. They came – 58,000 strong; but, when they came they occupied no space and made no sound.

They came. They stood with dignity as silent sentinels to history's painful legacy. They came without knowing what they might have become – the vast majority of them shy of 30 years of age – their lives over before they began to live. Yet they came anyway.

They came without the rest of us knowing what further contribution they might have made to human kind. But that's all right. We're just happy that they came. They've already done enough.

Pope Benedict: Abortion Resolves Nothing

‘Doctors, in particular, cannot fail to consider important the grave duty to defend against the deception of the conscience of many women who think they will find in abortion the solution to family, economic, social difficulties or to the problems of health of their children. Especially in this last situation, the woman is convinced, often by the doctors themselves, that abortion represents not only a licit moral choice, but that in addition it is a necessary "therapeutic" act to avoid the suffering of the child and of its family and an "unjust" burden to society.

“In a cultural background characterized by the eclipse of the meaning of life, in which the common perception of the moral gravity of abortion and of other forms of attempts against human life has been attenuated, exacted from doctors is a special fortitude to continue affirming that abortion does not resolve anything, but that it kills the child, destroys the woman and blinds the conscience of the child's father, often ruining family life.

“This duty, however, does not only affect the medical profession or health professionals. It is necessary that the whole of society defend the right to life of the conceived and the true good of the woman, who never, under any circumstance, will be fulfilled in the choice of abortion.” (From Address to the General Assembly of the Pontifical Academy for Life, February 27, 2011)

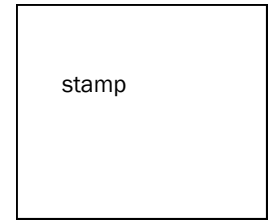

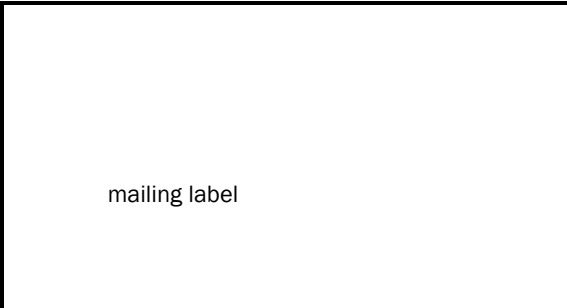

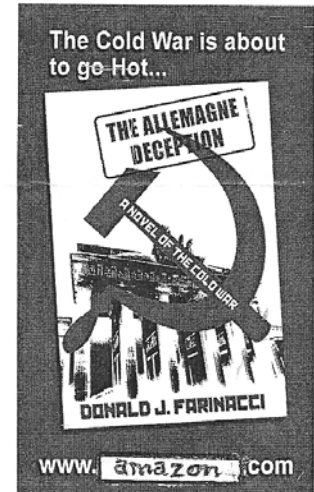
