## CHAPLAINS CORNER

### Infallibility

Dear Brothers of St. Joseph Council:

One of the most misunderstood doctrines (*teachings*) of the Catholic Church is that of infallibility. When Pope Pius XII declared the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, body and soul into heaven as an infallible (*without error*) truth in the Marian Year of 1950, it was not a capricious act, stating something new or of murky origin. To the contrary, though it is not directly attested to in Holy Scripture, the doctrine of Our Lady's Assumption was proclaimed by the apostles and other Christians who witnessed her being taken from their midst and into God's Presence. It was handed down through the *Sacred Tradition* of Holy Mother Church.

Liturgically, the Church has celebrated this act of God (on August 15) since at least the fifth century. The Holy Father, in union with the *ordinary Magisterium* (teaching authority) of the Church, was solemnly defining that which the Church had always believed and held to be true. Like the solemn declaration of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady in 1854 by Pope Pius IX, the Assumption was certainly no new teaching. The Pope prayerfully chose that point in time, when atheistic communism was exulting a Godless, soulless, materialism as the ultimate human goal to reinforce the true spiritual destiny of Man: that God wills all to be saved and share body and soul in the glorious resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states:

*The supreme degree of participation in the authority of Christ is ensured by the charism of infallibility. This infallibility extends as far as does the deposit of divine Revelation (The Holy Bible – G.Y.); it also extends to all those elements of doctrine, including morals, without which the saving truths of the faith cannot be preserved, explained, or observed. (#2035)*

*“The Roman Pontiff... enjoys this infallibility in virtue of his office, when, as supreme pastor and teacher of all the faithful... he proclaims by a definitive act a doctrine pertaining to faith or morals... The infallibility promised to the Church is also present in the body of bishops when, together with Peter's successor, they exercise the supreme Magisterium” above all in an Ecumenical Council. (#891)*

And also from the documents of the **Second Vatican Council**:

*Although the bishops, taken individually, do not enjoy the privilege of infallibility, they do, however, proclaim infallibly the doctrine of Christ on the following conditions: namely, when, even though dispersed throughout the world but preserving for all that amongst themselves and with Peter's successor the bond of communion, in their authoritative teaching concerning matters of faith and morals, they are in agreement that a particular teaching is to be held definitively and absolutely. (Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, #25)*

Even from this brief explanation of a very complex issue, it is clear to see that the conditions necessary for making an infallible declaration that is absolutely binding on the entire Church by the Supreme Pontiff and the body of bishops, can only come about within the strictest parameters, relying on the light of the Holy Spirit, who Christ promised to guide and be with His Holy Catholic Church until His return in glory.

The Holy Father and the bishops may make numerous doctrinal pronouncements on faith and morals – which are never to be taken lightly – but rarely are any of those solemnly declared as “infallible,” even though they very well may be. Anything taught as such is not a new revelation, but a belief which was present in seed-form from the very beginning of the Church. With the light of the Holy Spirit through

### COUNCIL MONTHLY CLOTHING/FOOD DRIVE

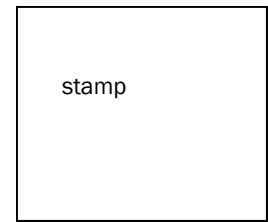

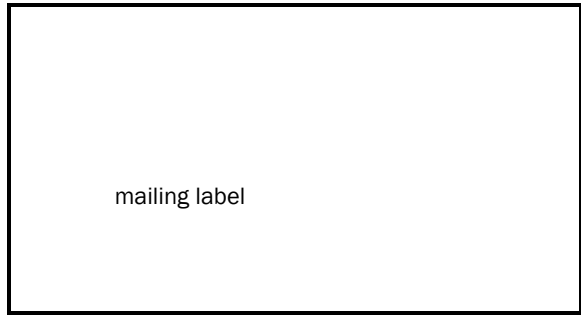
