**James Loughren III**

**May 9, 1936 – September 20, 2011**

The Brothers and Families of St. Joseph 4810 Council of the Knights of Columbus proudly dedicate this *Voyager* issue to the lasting memory of our beloved Brother and lifetime member, James Loughren III, Past Grand Knight, who departed us for his eternal reward on September 20, 2011.

A devoted husband, father and member, in the truest aspects of his Catholic faith, Jim befriended all those he met. A loving husband to his wife Diane and a caring father, Jim shared similar virtues of kindness with his Brothers when on October 1, 1966 he took his First Degree as a member with the Knights of Columbus. Characteristically, he truly emboldened the Knights most fundamental principle of *Charity* with his steadfast love and high regard for his fellow Brothers and friends as if they were his family. Jim volunteered his time in a most



tireless manner, holding Council and 4810 positions of increasing responsibility, eventually serving as Grand Knight for two full years. For so many years Jim also took the time and effort, with his beloved Diane, to plan several "Council" vacation trips for all his friends. Jim wanted all to share in a nice vacation trip. Recall in 1979 when Jimmy was planning a Bermuda cruise and a few members/friends thought they may not be able to come up with the full payment. Jim created the Loughren Installment Plan" whereby interim payments could be made so that by the time payment in full was due, the money was there. That's Jim thinking for the benefit of all to share. Who could ever forget the fun and laughs being together at *Villa Roma*, South Jersey Shore, Cape Cod, Rhode Island and *Woodloch Pines*. How about the daily late afternoon *Happy Hour* gatherings Jim and Diane so meticulously prepared on each trip. The Bloody Marys were strong and tasty.

Endless texts could be penned to point to what it was like to be Jim's friend. I was honored as one of them. I personally had the privilege to ride alongside Jim on the Long Island RR as a fellow commuter and share his conversations and values. He impressed me as so calming and amiable. He carried a soft gentleness and high ethical demeanor with his business acumen. I felt his pain as he was such a diehard *Mets'* fan. To this day I truly believe that Jim did not know how to say the word "no" or how to be untoward a person in need. Jim devoted so much of his business training and accounting skills to many of us, asking so little in return. Having lunch with him in New York City was enjoyable. Each Monday of the week Jim knew which Deli or sandwich shop had the best special of the day for that entire week. He would never forget to call me at 11:30AM sharp each day to invite me to join him. At the same time he found a few moments to visit the Chapel at Our Lady of Victory Catholic Church off Wall Street.

I am sure Jim touched all of you in a similar unique way.  
We will miss him dearly.

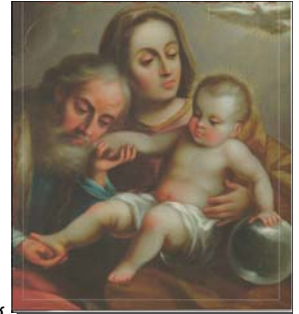

Brothers;

Your new chairs are being used upstairs now. They are working great, and looking great. Talking about looking good, the new floor was installed downstairs, and it really makes a difference. The final pieces have to be done, which is putting up the side moldings, resetting the radiator, and generally cleaning up the "upper half" of the basement. Once that is done we can look at our next big project. We're still trying to fill the bar area with Sports Memorabilia. If you have something that you think might be a good fit, bring it down. Certainly nothing that you don't want to see get lost or misplaced though....

We ran into a series of "Break-downs" over the past month or so. The Ice Machine Crapped out, as well as the Coffee Machine... Both are now fixed, some \$400 later. The biggest problem that we have right now is the "Ansul System" and the stove. The Town of Huntington Office of Fire Marshall now requires an inspection 2X a year, and upgrades. This will be a large part of our discussion at tomorrow night's meeting. One thing is for certain; treat a Fire Marshall just like he is an IRS auditor, even if you think he is your friend. DO NOT EVER offer up any information; let him do all the asking.

Our "Fall Clean-up" has gone behind the way-side. Due to a combination of us not being able to get together, or the Council Hall being used for Decorating on Saturday mornings, it has not happened. This will be discussed at the October 25 meeting.

Taking over running the functions is a bigger hurdle than I expected. The Golf Outing came in about \$400 behind budgeted profit, and the Octoberfest was cancelled (\$500 budget), as well as the Theatre Group (\$300 budget). That just means that we are going to have to do better in all remaining functions. Please keep in mind that these numbers drives the amount of Rent the council gets charged, not whether or not we can give additional monies to Charity or not. If during the year we have some "Banner" events, and we are able to drop the Council Rent even further, that's when we can go to the GK and say, please Worthy let's give some extra to this cause or that cause. Although everyone said that they understood what this concept meant, only a few really do. That's disappointing- at best.

**THE MARCH FOR LIFE AND FEDERAL LEGISLATION.** March for Life President, Nellie Gray, since day one, urged marchers to visit their legislators. If 1/22 falls on a weekend, the March is moved to a Monday, as in 1/23/2012, when offices are open. Due to the length of the March, plus security at buildings, **visiting legislators after the March has become next to impossible** and many skip this vital part of the March for Life. **Suggested alternatives include:**



- (a) arrive in Washington, D.C. at 10 or 10:30 AM to allow your group to visit representatives before marching;
- (b) arrive in Washington at 11:30 AM with each group having designated four or five lobbyists to go directly to the offices. Lobbyists may miss the March, or part of it, but your legislators will know his/her constituents, your school, church, etc. attended the March.
- (c) have the entire group lobby after the March if that has been successful.

Please let us know of other possible options. There is a serious need to lobby for pro-life legislation and to support legislators who have supported or promised to support pro-life legislation. Call LICL 631-243-1435 before January 5th as appointments with representatives must be made by your group or by the LICL.

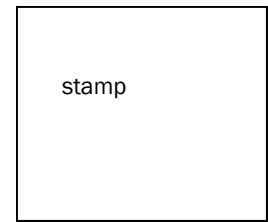

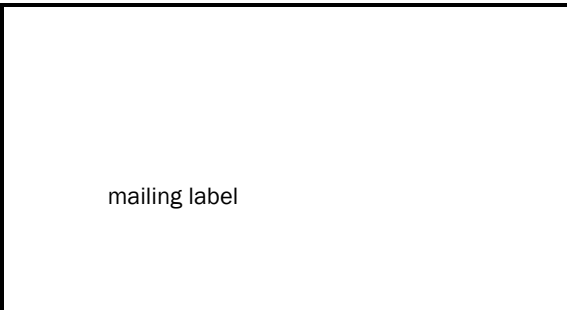
